FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

2015 has been a year of small and large victories. We hope you will take a few minutes and read about some of these meaningful stories. We have learned to celebrate the small victories like a month of sobriety or getting a good grade or the first day on a new job or consistent attendance at youth group because we know that large victories are more rare and usually come only after a string of small ones. Please celebrate the small victories with us as you read this 2015 annual report.

However, there is one large victory for ODM that I want to draw your attention to here. After seven years of dreaming, envisioning, and planning, we launched the Family Room construction on August 31, 2015. This addition to our main ministry building and church is creating a new reception area and welcome center for ODM participants, community members, and visitors to the ministry. Our doors, which were always locked before, will now truly be open.



The fund raising for the \$850,000 project started in late 2014 and proceeded right through 2015. As we finished the year, we were about 90% finished and the project itself was nearing completion. The projected completion date is March 2016 and we can't wait to move in. I want to thank everyone who has believed in this project and who has partnered with us in it. Being our largest capital campaign in our history by almost three times, it was a giant step of faith not only for us but for all those who have stood with us. We still need a few friends to help us close the chapter on our fund raising, so if you have not participated yet, we could use your help to complete this major victory.

Roman 8:37 says, "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us." As ministry participants and as a ministry as a whole, we take heart in Christ knowing that He is able to give us victory in all things.

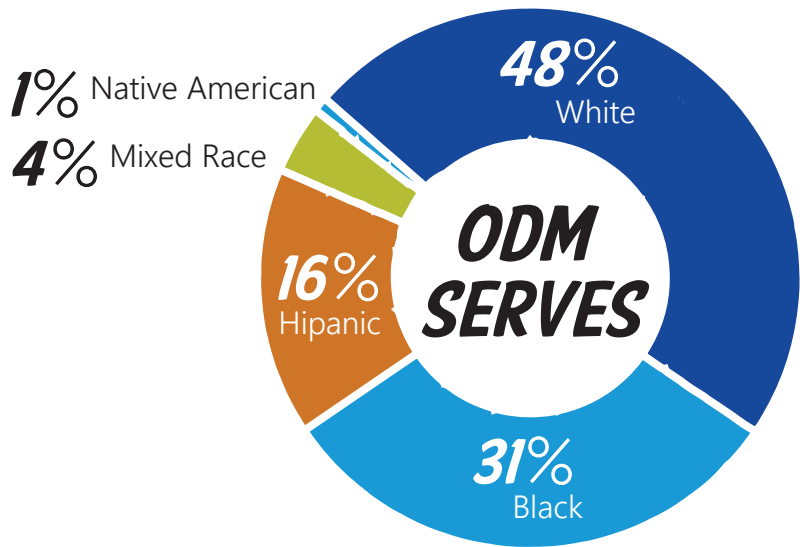

EMPHASIZING EDUCATION

We had the privilege of serving 34 Preschoolers and 39 School-Agers in 2015. In both classrooms, we were able to build relationships with each of the children and watch them grow academically, socially, emotionally and spiritually. 2015 also brought about many changes to the Childcare Center. We have changed our name to the Open Door Learning Center in order to emphasize the importance of education in our center. This summer we welcomed our new Director, Kathy Russell, to the Open Door team and have been truly blessed by her dedication and love for the Lord and the Learning Center. We are excited to see what the Lord has planned for 2016!



FREDDY'S STORY

This year, we have seen several new families come to the Learning Center. One of our new students, Freddy, came speaking very little English. Throughout the months that he has been with us, we have seen dramatic growth in many areas. He now is able to communicate in complete sentences and comprehends what is going on in the classroom. On top of learning his ABC's, colors and other academics, he is also growing in his social skills. He has made many friends and is learning how to resolve conflicts with his peers. He has come out of his shell and keeps us laughing. It's truly a joy to have Freddy in our Learning Center family! We have also been able to support his family as a whole in helping them find resources in Denver. We are excited to continue to build a strong relationship with this family throughout the coming years!

SANCTUARY HOUSING

SANCTUARY, SAFETY & HOSPITALITY

In 2015, Open Door Ministries brought together two ministries and created what we now call Sanctuary Housing. This ministry encompasses both the Women's Homeless Initiative, a group of 20 women that stay in Open Door's Sanctuary every Sunday night, and what we used to call "Emergency Housing", providing short term housing for those in our community who are in critical need of housing. While most of our housing on the block is designated for long-term programs, we have been able to house 15 people during 2015 and are excited to provide a place of sanctuary, safety, and hospitality to many more in 2016.

MALEYA'S STORY

After weeks of camping with her five children along the Platte River this fall, Maleya was desperate for a solution. She and her kids (ages 1 - 18) needed to escape an unsafe situation and they had fled to Colorado seeking refuge.

One day, some friends of ODM came across Maleya's family camping by the Platte. This couple had compassion on the family and quickly put them in touch with Open Door. We were able to house them through our Sanctuary Housing program, our newest ministry that exists to provide short-term shelter to individuals and families who are experiencing temporary hardship or homelessness.

The family moved into one of our basement apartments and began participating in our church and youth programs. After six weeks, Maleya decided to move closer to her extended family. We are grateful that we had the chance to befriend her and her five children and to provide shelter in such a time of need.

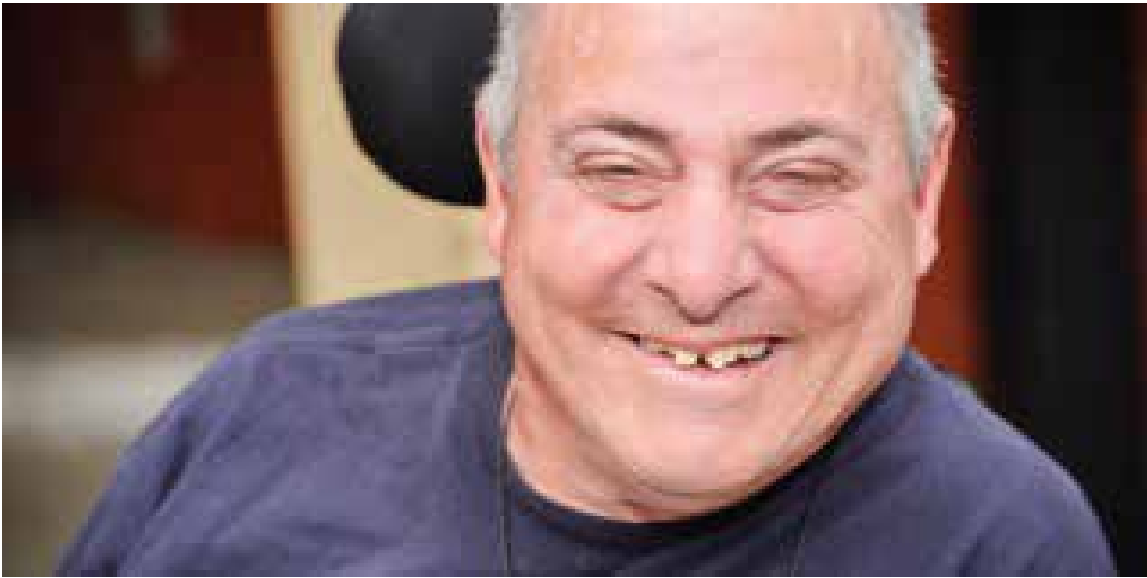
LIONEL'S STORY

A YEAR OF LEARNING, SERVING, & SHARING

RANDY'S STORY

One person who has shown great strides of growth in our group is Randy Milliken. Randy has been struggling with financial responsibility for many years now. In the process he has accumulated a significant amount of debt. This past year through encouragement and counseling he is changing negative habits. He has begun slowly paying off debt, saving money, and learning how to decide what things are truly valuable. Many disabled adults struggle in the area of money management. One of TRYAD's future goals is to help give coaching and encouragement to guide TRYAD participants in making wiser choices with their money. Hopefully, more individuals will be able to have some of the same victories as Randy.

ENGAGING IN URBAN DENVER

2015 was full of teenagers and adults who decided to give up a week or weekend, step outside their comfort zones, and serve at Open Door! We had 20 groups stay and serve with us this past year, traveling all the way from Ohio, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Florida, and all over Colorado. It was always amazing to watch as these groups engaged in urban Denver in a unique way that they had never experienced before. This year we honed our program to focus on three key areas: service, learning, and community engagement. We also had the privilege of working with an organization called Youth Works, who brought 50 students on a weekly basis throughout the summer to participate in our Poverty Scavenger Hunt activity. We are looking forward to what God has in store for the many groups scheduled for 2016!

CARINA'S STORY

This summer we had the joy of working with three fantastic interns that essentially ran all of our summer programming. One of these interns was Carina, a participant in Open Door's Next Step Internship Program through the Youth Center. Carina, a participant of the ODM youth program since she was a little girl) was on the third phase of this program and had the opportunity to serve as an intern with Urban Missions. It was so fun to see someone who has gone through our programs give back in this way.

THE TABLE

FIRST EXPERIENCES IN URBAN MINISTRY

In 2015, The Table was completely filled with groups and it was the first year we didn't have to scramble to find people to serve Sunday night meals. We had a combination of churches that have been serving this meal for over ten years and groups that were totally new to it. We love watching the relationships built from groups that have been consistent for years and also the opportunity this ministry gives to new groups to get their feet wet in urban ministry for the first time. The first people through the line are always the Women's Homelessness Initiative ladies and it's been a very welcoming place for them week after week.

RUDY'S STORY

Rudy has been serving at The Table for over 10 years, bringing together groups of people from churches all over the Denver metro area to serve the homeless at Open Door. After so many years of consistent service, Rudy has grown to know almost everyone in the congregation that attends the meal. He knows their food likes and dislikes and remembers important details about their lives. His groups always make The Table fun and festive around holidays, making it feel like the furthest thing from a soup kitchen. We are so grateful for Rudy and the long-term relationships he has built within our community!



STREET2LIFE

BUILDING CAPACITY AT STREET2LIFE

Many exciting things have happened at Street2Life this year:

- The Print Shop turned 3 in October.
- We had 71 orders, totaling \$45,189.15
- We printed 5,852 garments
- We employed 7 people, 4 graduated to permanent employment, 2 sadly did not graduate and the other is currently still with us and going great.

Street2Life ministry, including outreach, Sunday Family Meals, one-on-ones, devotions, morning prayer and the Street2Life Print Shop, has ministered to over 113 people in 2015. Joel Anderson joined us as the Print Shop Business Manager in August and we are so thankful for him; he is such a great addition to the team. We were busy all year, increased our production capacity, and bought a second print press in December which will enable us to employ more people.

ISSAC'S STORY

Issac came to the print shop as a referral in January 2015. When he first came on he was very unsure of himself and had very little confidence. But he hung in there and after a few months as we all got to know each other, Issac's confidence grew. He eventually became not only our best printer but a very valuable asset as a person. During morning devotions he often offered up some great words of wisdom and insight that came with the "street cred" necessary to reach some of our other employees. He eventually became the print shop supervisor and trainer. One of our current employees has grown to where he is now because of time spent with Issac. After almost a full year, Issac left us on good terms to explore other possibilities and is welcome back anytime.



OPEN DOOR TO SUCCESS

BUILDING A CONSISTENT PROGRAM

2015 for Open Door to Success was a great year! By God's grace we were able to run eight 5-week sessions during the year, which puts us running almost year round. In those 8 sessions we were able to touch the lives of 66 students.

At the beginning of the year we were able to partner with the Denver Rescue Mission. Any man that attends Open Door to Success is guaranteed a bed each night that they stay in the program. DRM will actually let them keep their bed for 2-3 weeks after graduation to help them get a job and get a couple of pay checks in their pockets to be able to afford other housing.

HARVEY'S STORY

Harvey learned to cook in prison, but had a dream of becoming a French pastry cook. He had even dreamed of going to France one day to learn French methods. Shortly after he graduated Open Door to Success, we discovered the Auguste Escoffier Culinary School in Boulder. The school has two programs, one of which specifically focuses on becoming a French Pastry Chef. The school has helped Harvey with housing, transportation, employment and tuition! In just a few months Harvey will graduate as a French pastry chef and realize a long-held "impossible" dream. Praise God!



NEHEMIAH LEADERSHIP HALL

EXPLORING THE CITY

In 2015 we housed Open Door Ministries interns, participants and staff for the Center for Student Missions, students participating in Denver Urban Semester, and more. Nehemiah Leadership Hall is a base for these young men and women to go out and explore the city as one of its residents. Many of our 2016 residents came from rural areas, so city living was an entirely new experience for them. They were able to serve, learn, and participate in the many fun things Denver has to offer, while also having a safe place to come back to and debrief their experiences.

EMILY'S STORY

Emily joined the ODM intern team in May of 2016 as our Urban Missions and Nonprofit Management intern. She is a great example of someone who fully embraced her internship experience of living in Denver. Emily took her "urban training," so to speak, and immediately put it into action as she passed her training on to the Urban Missions groups she was leading. She also spent much of her time working with the development team at ODM and went on to get a part time job that fall working with development and fundraising at a nonprofit in Boulder. We were so blessed to have her serve with us last summer!



CORNERSTONE HOME

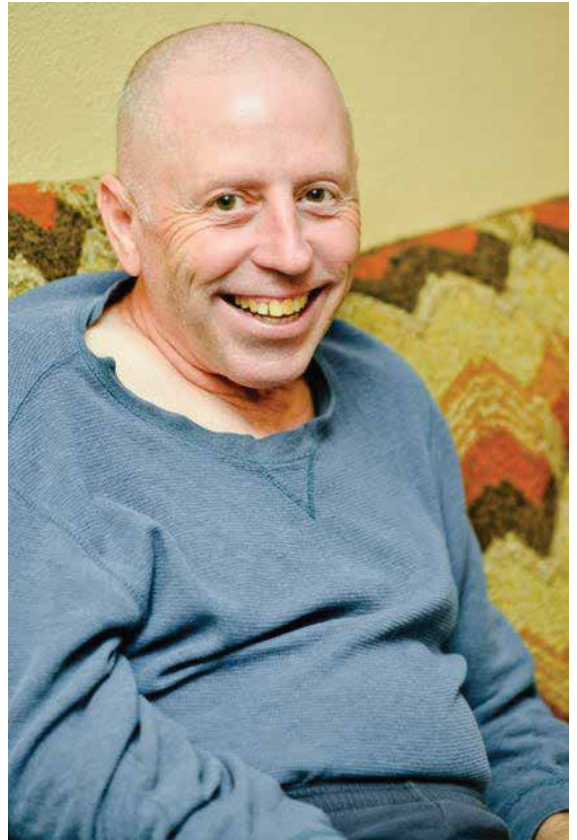

It was very difficult for him to find a place to live due to his criminal record and low income. It's a perfect place for him to pay low rent and find supportive community. We are thankful that Cornerstone Home exists for disabled men in situations like his.

We had three baptisms: two in the Platte River & one in the horse trough. Four residents celebrated over one year sobriety. All faithfully attended church, found healing community, and served others in various beautiful ways. There were numerous God sightings where He showed each of us, staff, residents & volunteers, His great love & care for us! Together we read through the New Testament & lived in the middle of miracles.

NAOMI'S STORY

Twenty years ago, Andy Cannon met a man and his young daughter in a desperate situation. Seeing this man's need, Andy offered practical help and hope to this man and his two-year old daughter, Naomi. The man made the decision to follow Christ and became a part of Andy's church on Colfax. Now fast forward to fall of 2014. Naomi, now a grown woman, found herself in another desperate situation. When calling the 211 crisis helpline, she was referred to ODM by someone who used to live in Treasure House. Naomi has now lived in Chayah House for a year and it is remarkable to see God's transformational work in her life! She is finding increasing stability as she grows in her walk with Christ, learns to let go of the past, and is now pursuing her GED. Naomi is now on staff with Open Door, working in the Learning Center. She says that God has given her a joy she's never known before!

ESTHER HOUSE

EBONY'S STORY

Ebony arrived at Esther House in the summer of 2014. Through major transition in 2015, Ebony remained as the only resident at Esther House for a time. She was able to see God's goodness and faithfulness through all the change and chose to trust God as her strength, as well as the love, commitment and support from Danielle, the Interim and later Assistant Director of Esther House. Ebony completed her first semester back in school, where she is pursuing a degree in Human Services with hopes to use her personal story and experience to invest back into the lives of others. We celebrated Ebony's baptism in October and have been so encouraged watching her faith in God grow. Ebony has welcomed new staff and residents, and God continues to bring healing and redemption into her life. Ebony has brought so much joy, love, laughter and light to Esther House, being a constant encouragement to all those who come into contact with her. We are so thankful to have her at Esther House and excited to see God continue to work in and through her during the rest of her time here!



TREASURE HOUSE

AROUND THE TABLE

Treasure House was home for 8 women, 10 children and 2 staff in 2015. Dinner around the table each night was filled with praying together, sharing about our days, teaching manners, some crying, a home cooked meal, a bunch of high chairs and life being shared together. In April, we welcomed and moved in a part-time Assistant Director. As a staff team of 2 we continue to strive to share with the moms and children "not only God's good news but our own lives too" (1 Thessalonians 2:8). Throughout the year Treasure House shared in many significant moments, including a mom obtaining a new and better job, a mom gaining custody of her two children, and celebrating a mom's birthday, which was her first sober birthday in more than 10 years. We saw tremendous growth in two of our 2 year olds with tantrums and screaming, with time and staff support their moms worked on setting limits, following through with consequences and helping their child use their words.

SHANA'S STORY

By living together in community we have the unique privilege to notice and celebrate small victories, the moments when we see a small step of progress, the effort and courage someone has taken to make a hard but healthy choice or the evident growth in someone's life that we've been working towards for months. Shana came to Treasure House this year working on regaining custody of her one-year-old twins. While at Treasure House she celebrated 8 months of sobriety, obtained employment and continued in substance abuse treatment. She also obtained custody of her twins and transitioned them to living at Treasure House, we were able to see them take their first steps and help her with establishing routine and structure in their day. We hope that their time at Treasure House helps create a firm foundation in parenting, in faith and in living a more healthy life.



CHALLENGES, VICTORIES, & VISION

This past year was a great year for Lighthouse, full of change, challenges, victories, vision, and renovation. We saw our Assistant Director of three years, Bill Downer, move on to work with Providence Network. Although we were sad, we were so happy to see him grow in a new ministry position. In perfect timing, God provided a new Assistant Director, Matthew Reed, who settled right in and is already just one of the guys!

Many men's lives have been changed over the past year and many goals have been met. With help from the Holy Spirit, we were challenged, able to change, and saw a lot of growth. The outside of the house is being renovated as well as the inside. A vision of a beautiful community room, which seemed like a mere dream, became a reality. Altogether, 2015 once again demonstrated God's faithfulness and His love for us at the Lighthouse.

FRANK'S STORY

With what seemed like an uphill battle that he would never win, Frank became extremely frustrated and ready to give up. Frank had not had his driver's license for 6 years due to having two tickets in Colorado, two in California, one in Oregon and one in Washington. There was nothing left for Frank to do but surrender it to the Lord and for us to together tackle the problem head-on. We first dealt with the tickets in Colorado and Oregon and that left us with 3 more to go.

After pleading with Washington via phone and then writing a letter, we got a call from the D.A.'s office saying Frank was free and clear of his ticket there. Frank did not have to pay a dime or travel to the state. We were so amazed at God's hand at work.

California was next, and the first ticket for that state, God provided \$600 through the Cherry Creek Presbyterian Church and Frank paid the rest off with his savings, leaving just 1 ticket left. In order to deal with the last ticket, Frank had to physically fly to California and stand before the judge. With our recent victories, we knew God could do anything. Through multiple donations, God provided enough money for plane tickets, hotel rooms, a rental car, and gas, so we set the court date and headed out to California. We sat in front of the judge terrified of what he might say, only to get to Frank's turn and to our surprise, the judge threw the case out. He stated that it went back too far, so he disregarded the charges and right then and there, Frank was free and clear and we couldn't believe it. What took 6 years on Frank's own strength, God accomplished in less than 2 months. Today Frank has a great relationship with the Lord and not only has his driver's license, but his commercial driver's license. Praise God, there is so much power in surrender.

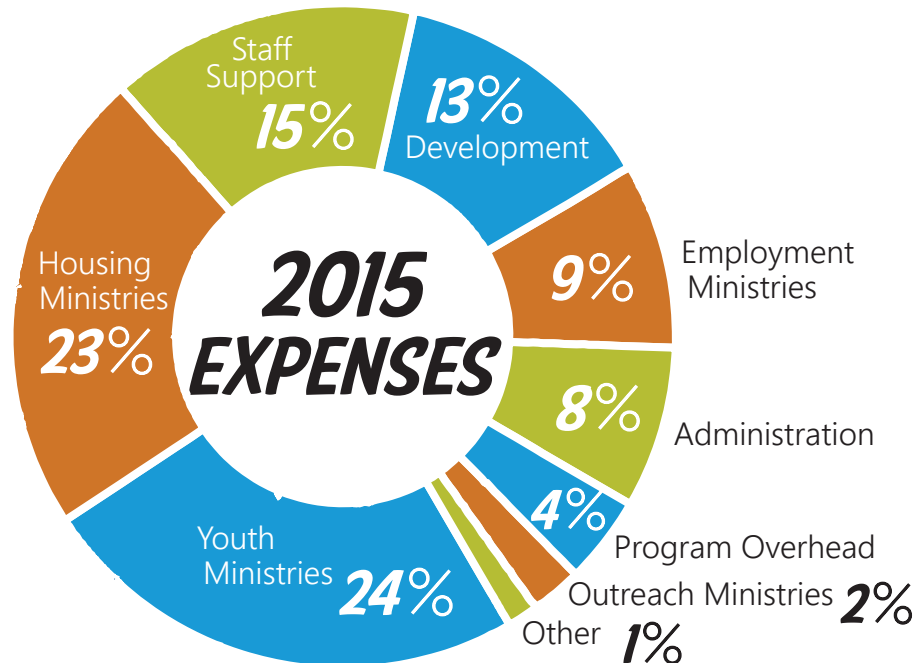

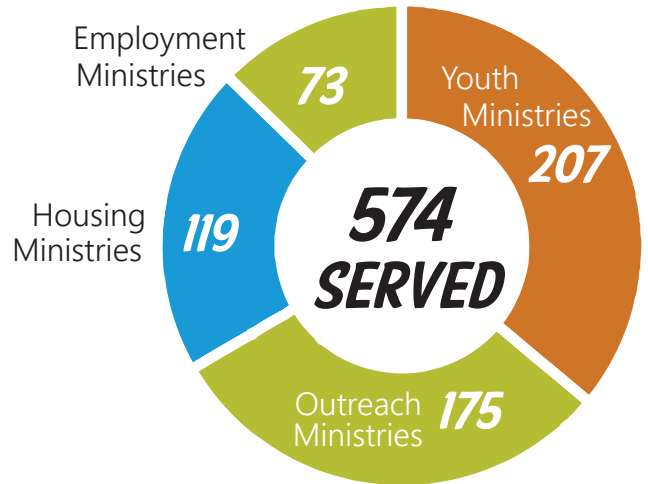

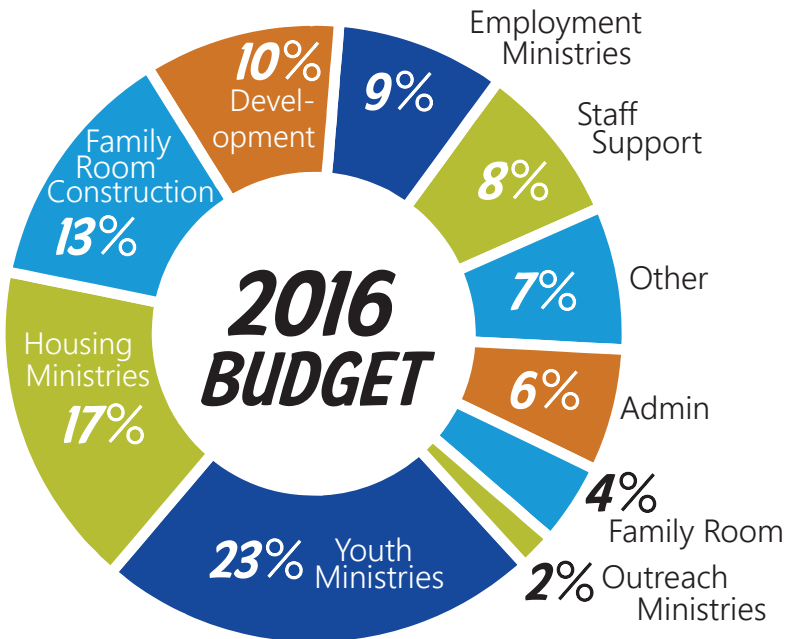
